## What is Addiction?

Rather, addiction is a neuropsychological disorder that causes one to continue using drugs or alcohol despite negative consequences. Over time, heavy use can even change your brain chemistry, making it harder and harder to quit.

Addiction is also a chronic disease, like asthma or hypertension. That means it is the result of many factors, including genetics, lifestyle choices, and patterns of use. Very often, it is also the result of trauma or a mental disorder that is co-occurring, or exists alongside the addiction.

#### Veterans, Mental Health, & Addiction



Sadly, veterans certainly experience trauma at rates much higher than civilians. The numbers vary depending on the study and the sector of the military that is the focus, but rates of PTSD among veterans can be as high as 38%. According to the National Center for PTSD, that number is only 8% among civilian women and 4% among civilian men. What's more, more than 20% of veterans who struggle with PTSD also struggle with addiction.

And, it isn't just PTSD. One study by the US government found that more than 90% of veterans who served in Iraq or Afghanistan abused substances and had at least one mental health disorder, including depression, anxiety, and more.

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## What Happens in Addiction Treatment


Because addiction and mental health disorders are so intertwined, the goal of modern addiction treatment is to heal both simultaneously. From the start, when you decide to explore addiction treatment the admissions team will ask you about both your substance use and any possible mental or emotional issues. Most people struggling from addiction and PTSD or trauma benefit from prolonged residential addiction treatment of 30 to 90 days or more.

At intake, you will be given a more comprehensive analysis before settling into your comfortable new home. You may meet other individuals enrolled in the program — all of whom are going through the same struggle as you. Depending on the nature of your detox, you may be prescribed medication to help you come down from your normal substance use.

treatments like EMDR (eye movement desensitization and reprogramming), which involves flashing lights or visual cues to reprogram your brain's perspective on painful events. It could be something as relaxing as a yoga class. Learning how to enjoy daily activities again is a big part of recovery. Every step of the way, your team will be there to support you, letting you set the pace as you heal and build towards a new life.
